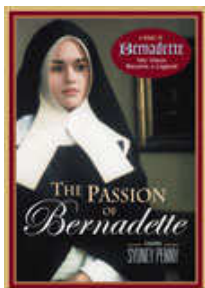


The Song of Bernadette

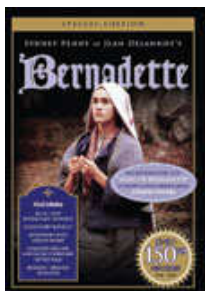


Passion of Bernadette

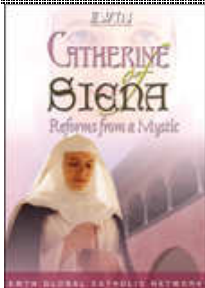
Bernadette 2nd Edition *150th Anniversary Edition*

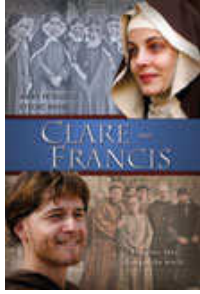

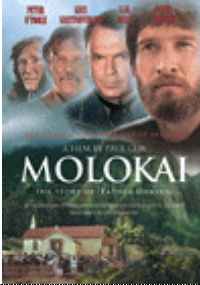


Clare and Francis

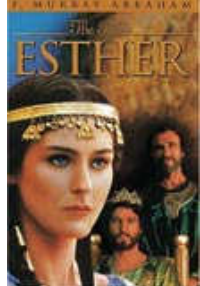

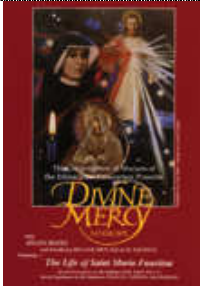

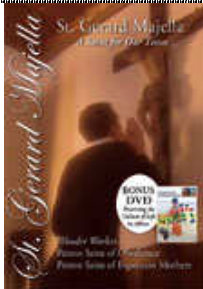


Saint Francis

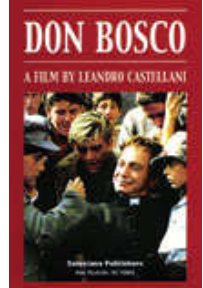

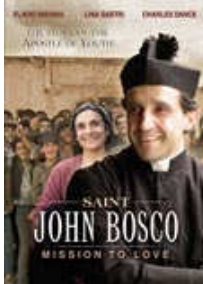

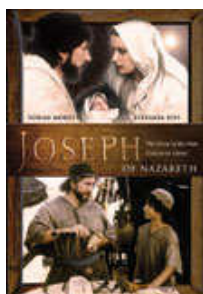


The Reluctant Saint

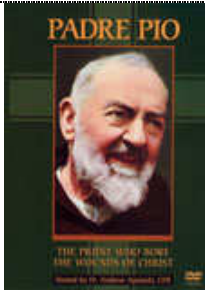

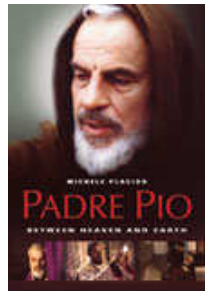


Padre Pio

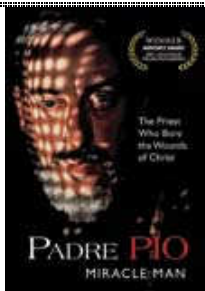
Padre Pio

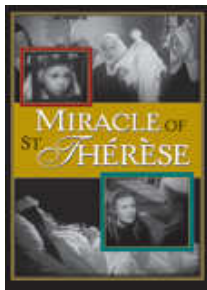
Therese

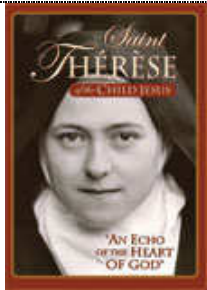


Miracle of St. Therese
